

Join the Santa Barbara Museum of Art and our co-sponsoring organization, the World Affairs Council of Philadelphia, aboard the intimate 18-cabin *Queen Eleganza* for a cruise along the spectacular Adriatic coast. Throughout history, Romans, Byzantines, Venetians, Ottomans, and Austrians have vied for control of this strategic coastline that is dotted with over 1,000 islands. In a region well worth exploring for its natural beauty alone, visit spellbinding archaeological sites, impressive castles, dramatic palaces, and ancient city centers.

Begin the program in the magnificent walled city of Dubrovnik, Croatia before embarking on a 7-night Adriatic cruise. Launched in 2018, the beautiful and intimate 18-cabin *Queen Eleganza* yacht features a casual ambiance and the ability to call at small, inviting islands and ports not accessible to large cruise ships. Cruise the Croatian coast from Dubrovnik to Zadar, calling at Mljet, Korčula, Hvar, Split, and Trogir. On free evenings, enjoy the ease of stepping off the yacht and right into the towns to explore and dine independently. After disembarking the ship, travel by motorcoach to walk amongst the waterfalls at Plitvice Lakes National Park then continue to Slovenia's captivating capital city, Ljubljana, and magical Lake Bled.

You will be joined by educational experts: Art Historian Eric Frank and Emmy Award-Winning Journalist Rickey Bevington, who will enrich the journey through a series of illustrated lectures and informal discussion. The planned content from Rickey and Eric will be an exploration of the intersection of politics and art in the region we are visiting. TRIP HIGHLIGHTS

- Delve into the historic sights of Dubrovnik, Pearl of the Adriatic.
- Marvel at the well-preserved Roman Forum in Zadar and the ruins of Emperor Diocletian's Palace in Split.
- Investigate the UNESCO World Heritage site of Trogir, an island dating back to the Hellenistic period embellished by successive rulers with Romanesque, Renaissance, and Baroque architecture.
- Visit the Meštrović Gallery, a stunning villa that served as the summer home for the talented Croatian artist and architect Ivan Meštrović and now displays his powerful sculptures.
- Explore Ljubljana, Slovenia's charming capital city, and ride gondola-like pletnas, flat-bottomed wooden boats, on the remarkably blue waters of Lake Bled.
- Take guided walks at Plitvice National Park on wooden walkways and bridges through the magical landscape of cascading waterfalls, picturesque pools, and lush vegetation.
- Moor at or near town centers aboard the yacht Queen Eleganza, with easy walk-off access to explore and dine independently during evenings at leisure.
- Learn from enriching onboard lectures by tour study leaders Eric Frank and Rickey Bevington.

STUDY LEADERS



ERIC FRANK

Art Historian

Educated at Dartmouth College and New York University's Institute of Fine Arts, Eric Frank is a Fellow of the American Academy in Rome and an expert in Italian Renaissance art with a special interest in the history of art and architecture of the classical tradition, from Greece and Rome to the Renaissance. Dr. Frank is an ideal study leader for this program, which will examine the ancient Roman, Medieval, and Venetian Renaissance sites of Slovenia and Croatia, including the great Palace of the Emperor Diocletian in Split. A noted scholar, Dr. Frank served as Chair of the Department of Art and Art History at Occidental College in Los Angeles and as Dean of the College and Vice President for Academic Affairs. He is the recipient of Occidental's Linda and Tod White Teaching and Mentorship Prize. Dr. Frank has previously lectured on SBMA programs, where his engaging insights into the history of art architecture in the Adriatic and Mediterranean were highly praised.



RICKEY BEVINGTON

President of the World Affairs Council of Atlanta, Emmy Award-Winning Journalist, and Executive in Residence at Georgia State University's Robinson College of Business

Rickey Bevington, an Emmy award-winning journalist, serves as President of the World Affairs Council of Atlanta and is an Executive in Residence at Georgia State University's Robinson College of Business. She spent two decades as a decorated broadcaster for NPR and PBS, notably hosting NPR's All Things Considered on Georgia Public Broadcasting. Voted "Best On Air Personality" by the Georgia Association of Broadcasters, Bevington is also a Life Member of the Council on Foreign Relations and graduated magna cum laude from Barnard College with a degree in Comparative Literature.









ITINERARY

SATURDAY-SUNDAY, MAY 23-24

DEPART U.S. / DUBROVNIK, CROATIA

Depart the U.S. on an overnight flight to Dubrovnik, Croatia. Upon arrival, transfer to Hotel Dubrovnik Palace, overlooking the Adriatic Sea, for a reception and Welcome Dinner. Hotel Dubrovnik Palace (R.D.)

MONDAY, MAY 25

DUBROVNIK

Take in iconic sites on a morning walking tour of historic Dubrovnik. Noted for its expansive walls and red tile rooftops, Dubrovnik is perhaps the most-visited destination on the Adriatic coast. Explore the sites along the marble-clad Stradun, including Onofrio's Fountain, St. Blaise's Church, and the Franciscan Church and Monastery, a large complex belonging to the Order of the Friars Minor and consisting of a monastery, church, library, and pharmacy, the latter of which dates from 1317. Take advantage of free time in the afternoon to explore the maze of alleyways and Renaissanceera architecture before embarking Queen Eleganza for a welcome reception aboard the ship, followed by dinner.

TUESDAY, MAY 26

MLJET

Following a morning lecture by one of our study leaders, relax on the sun deck while cruising to the island of Mljet. At Mljet National Park, walk or e-bike amongst shady forests of Aleppo pine or swim in a saltwater lake. Dinner is at leisure this evening so that you can discover local cuisine in nearby restaurants.

WEDNESDAY, MAY 27

KORČULA

After breakfast, enjoy a talk offered by one of our study leaders. En route to the fortified town of Korčula, there will be an option to swim in a calm cove (weather permitting). Perched on a promontory on its namesake island, Korčula is rich in vineyards and olive groves, picturesque villages, and a glorious old town, as well as age-old religious ceremonies, folk music, and dance traditions. Following an insightful walking tour, sample local delicacies and some of Croatia's most famous wines at a family-owned winery. Queen Eleganza (B,L)

THURSDAY, MAY 28

HVAR

Today cruise to lavender-scented Hvar Island, known as the "Queen of the Dalmatian islands." Stroll along the elegant main square and visit the Franciscan Monastery to see Ptolemy's Atlas and the magnificent painting of the Last Supper by Matej Ponzoni. Next admire lace carefully made by nuns from agave threads at the Benedictine Monastery. Independently walk the yacht-filled waterfront and restaurant-lined avenues this evening.

FRIDAY, MAY 29

SPLIT

After a morning lecture, call at sophisticated Split, Croatia's second largest city. Call at sophisticated Split, Croatia's second largest city. Upon arrival, tour Roman Emperor Diocletian's Palace, an imposing ancient structure spread along the waterfront. Enjoy ample time at leisure to wander the pedestrian Old Town, and in the evening, take the opportunity to try local delicacies.

SATURDAY, MAY 30

TROGIR

Begin the morning with a tour of Meštrović Gallery, the former summer residence of sculptor Ivan Meštrović which now showcases his large works of art.



Cruise to Trogir with another possible swimming opportunity in a quiet cove. A walking tour introduces the tiny, but charming Old Town of Trogir, a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site. For dinner, savor a traditional *peka*, meat and potatoes slowly roasted over coals under an iron bell. *Queen Eleganza* (B,L,D)

SUNDAY, MAY 31

AT SEA/ZADAR

Enjoy a morning at sea with time for a final on-board lecture en route to Zadar, a city which boasts a rich history dating as far back to the Neolithic era. Take a walking tour of Zadar and admire the ancient Roman Forum and the cylindrical-shaped Church of St. Donat. The streets of the old town are paved with shining white marble, and the inviting waterfront is a magnet for art lovers. Gather on board this evening for a final dinner on the *Queen Eleganza*. *Queen Eleganza* (B,L,D)



MONDAY, JUNE 1

LJUBLJANA, SLOVENIA

Disembark this morning and travel to Plitvice Lakes National Park, one of Croatia's most-loved national parks. Walk on wooden pathways amongst cascading waterfalls, picturesque pools, and lush vegetation before arriving in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Check in to the well-located Grand Hotel Union and take the opportunity to dine independently in Slovenia's vibrant capital this evening.

TUESDAY, JUNE 2

LJUBLJANA

This morning tour Ljubljana's historic Old Town, which is off limits to automobiles, and explore the cobblestone streets, bridges, and markets found in Slovenia's charming capital city. See the famous Dragon Bridge and stroll along the ancient Roman wall. Travel by motorcoach to picturesque Lake Bled and take a gondola-like pletna, a flat-bottomed wooden boat, with a history dating to the 12th century, to visit Slovenia's only island—a church-crowned islet in the center of the lake. Return to Ljubljana for a Farewell Dinner.








QUEEN ELEGANZA

The intimate and casual yacht, *Queen Eleganza*, launched in the spring of 2018, was beautifully crafted in Croatia specifically to cruise the Adriatic coastline. With a maximum of just 34 guests, there is a relaxed and informal atmosphere on board. The 18 cabins are finished to high standards with sleek lines and neutral colors. The bar/restaurant and lounge boast comfortable seating areas, large windows, and complimentary tea/coffee. Meals are served in a single seating and feature fresh and tasty Mediterranean cuisine with beer and wine included.

GENERAL INFORMATION

WHAT TO EXPECT

This is a moderately strenuous program that is at times physically demanding and busy. Participants must be physically fit, active, and in good health. Daily programs involve walking one to two miles-through city centers, historic sites, and in museums, where there may also be extended periods of standing. Participants will encounter uneven terrain, including dirt and cobblestoned paths, and must be able to walk at least 20 minutes up and down hills without stopping. Participants must be able to stand outside for up to two hours with limited shade and no available seating. All participants will be required to follow safety/sanitization protocols set forth by SBMA and Criterion Travel, local staff, and host country laws. If the tour manager decides that a participant cannot visit a site safely or in a timely manner, their judgment will be final. Where possible, an alternate activity may be suggested; additional costs may apply.

GROUP SIZE

This program is limited to 28 participants including travelers from the Santa Barbara Museum of Art and the World Affairs Council of Philadelphia.

HEALTH

All participants should be in good health and capable of keeping up with an active group of travelers. By forwarding the deposit for passage, the participant certifies that he/she does not have any physical or other condition or disability that would create a hazard for him/herself or other participants.

ITINERARY CHANGES

The itinerary presented for this tour is subject to modification and change by the Santa Barbara Museum of Art and Criterion Travel. Every reasonable effort will be made to operate the program as planned; however, should unforeseen world events and conditions require the itinerary to be altered, Santa Barbara Museum of Art and the tour operator reserve the right to do so for the safety and best interest of the group. Any extra expenses incurred in this situation are the responsibility of the participant.

A NOTE ABOUT RATES

Tour rates are based upon current fuel prices, currency values, taxes, tariffs, and a minimum number of participants. While we will do everything possible to maintain the listed rates, they are subject to change. If there are significant changes, details and costs will be advised prior to departure.

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Complete Terms and Conditions including a Statement of Responsibility will be made available at time of registration, or in advance upon request. A signed "Terms & Conditions, Release from Liability, Assumption of Risk and Binding Arbitration Clause" is required from each applicant prior to participation on the tour.

RESERVATIONS & PAYMENTS

A deposit of \$1,000 per person is required to reserve space on this program. You may also fax the form to (805) 966-6840. An interim payment of \$2,000 per person is due 6 months prior to departure, which is November 24, 2025. Final payment deadline is January 23, 2026 (120 days prior to departure). Interim and final payments may be made by check, wire transfer or credit card (credit card payments will incur a processing fee of 2%).

CANCELLATIONS & REFUNDS

Upon payment of the \$1,000 per person deposit, all reservations are subject to the cancellation provisions set forth below and by which the passenger agrees to be bound. Cancellations shall not be in effect until they are received in writing. Deposits are refundable, less a \$500 per person admin fee, if written notice of cancellation is received within 30 days of booking; after that, deposits are 100% nonrefundable. After the November 24, 2025 interim payment deadline: All payments are non-refundable after the interim payment. Trip cancellation insurance is strongly recommended. NOTE: Neither the Santa Barbara Museum of Art nor Criterion Travel, the tour operator, accepts liability for any airline cancellation penalties incurred with the purchase of non-refundable tickets.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Travel insurance for trip cancellation and interruption, medical problems, baggage loss and delay, etc., is highly recommended. Trip cancellation policies that apply to this

are included in this brochure. Information about travel insurance will be sent to confirmed participants.
