

Excursion: *Pecorino Cheese.* Visit a farm where Pecorino, a cheese made from sheep's milk, is produced. Indulge in a tasting of this traditional Tuscan cheese, often served at the end of a meal with pears, walnuts and honey.

Admire the many artistic and architectural treasures in the hill town of Cortona. Delight in its exceptional Etruscan features as you stroll past historic palazzi and through charming piazzas. See the Romanesque cathedral, and visit the 14th-century Praetorian Palace. Inside, the Museum of the Etruscan Academy will astound you with archaeological finds and important Etruscan, Greek, Roman and Egyptian works of art, mosaics and collections of engraved gems.

Local Flavor: Enjoy lunch at a restaurant in the pastoral Tuscan countryside.

Educational Focus: *Renaissance Art.* Learn how the increased awareness of nature, the revival of classical learning and the more individualistic view of humanity shaped the art of the Renaissance.

DAY FIVE Florence

Excursion: Cradle of the Renaissance.

The capital of Tuscany, Florence is a veritable open-air museum, an urban masterpiece spread along the banks of the River Arno.



Explore the city center and discover how the city's wealth of creative genius left it laden with fine art and stunning architecture around every turn. See the Old Palace, the Ponte Vecchio, the Cathedral of Santa Meria del Fiore, the Piazza della Signoria and more.

Independent Exploration: The afternoon is at leisure in Florence. Explore on your own. Visit the Uffizi Gallery or the Galleria dell'Accademia, home to Michelangelo's David.

SAN GIMIGNANO | CASTELLINA Excursion: *Tuscany's Magnificent Hill*

Country. Explore the legendary wine region of Chianti during a full-day outing. See the 14 stone towers of San Gimignano soaring skyward as you approach this once wealthy and powerful 14th-century town. Then journey along the Chianti Road to the well-preserved medieval town of Castellina, once an important Florentine garrison.

Cultural Event and Local Flavor: *The Tuscan Table.* Learn the secrets of Tuscan cooking during a demonstration by a local chef in Castellina before enjoying Tuscan fare for lunch.

Educational Focus: *Meet the People.* Learn about modern-day life in Tuscany

through a discussion with local residents.

DAY SEVEN **SIENA**

Excursion: *Siena.* Journey to Siena and wander its labyrinth of majestic Gothic architecture. The city has remained remarkably unchanged throughout the centuries.

Visit the Gaia Fountain, the art-filled Mangia Tower and the unforgettable, black-andgold-striped Duomo.

Independent Exploration: Choose one of Siena's excellent restaurants for lunch, and explore the city during time at leisure.

Educational Focus: *A Contemporary View of Italy.* Attend a discussion of Italy's place in the European Union and an assessment of its modern-day political, economic and social status.

DAY EIGHT B | D Colle di Val d'Elsa | Castello di Monsanto

Excursion: ColleVilca Crystal Museum.

Crystal and glass goods have been made in Colle di Val d'Elsa for more than eight centuries, and the town is considered to be Italy's crystal capital. Learn about the production of crystal and glass goods.

Cultural Event: *Discovering Chianti Classico* Travel to the Castello di Monsanto winery, keeper of the largest reserve of Chianti Classico in the region. Wine is central to Tuscany's economy and way of life. The region's soil and hospitable weather conditions are perfect for growing grapes. **Independent Exploration:** Enjoy some

time at leisure for lunch and last-minute



shopping and sightseeing.

Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a Farewell Reception followed by a special Farewell Dinner held at a restaurant in an ancient wheat mill.



EXPERIENCING TUSCANY

Tuscany. The very word brings forth a palette of warm, earthy hues: sunflower yellow, rich burgundy, soft sage and soothing lavender. A morning walk through a Tuscan village's narrow cobbled streets is vibrant with the sensory experiences of an awakening town: the aroma of espresso brewing for cappuccino and freshly baked cornetti, Italy's version of the croissant; the sounds of shopkeepers preparing for the day; and the warm caress of the sun.

You can smell Tuscany in its gardens, the autumn grape harvest and the mouth-watering aromas wafting from wood-burning ovens in local kitchens. Your taste buds yearn for the rustic flavors of Tuscan cuisine: tender Florentine beef; delicately fried artichokes; satisfying pastas; and, of course, internationally beloved wines.

Close your eyes and you can hear Tuscany in the sound of church bells, Puccini's arias and the calls of crested larks and Sardinian warblers. You sense the soul of the place in the silence of its countryside and in the cadence of the melodic Italian language.

But perhaps what is most memorable is the tactile experience. Tuscany is a weathered, welcoming place that begs to be touched, from hand-plastered walls and shaded stone pathways to the firm, bright fruit bursting to life in citrus groves. A day here is one of passion, of awakening, of life lived well. Exercise well your five senses in Tuscany!
