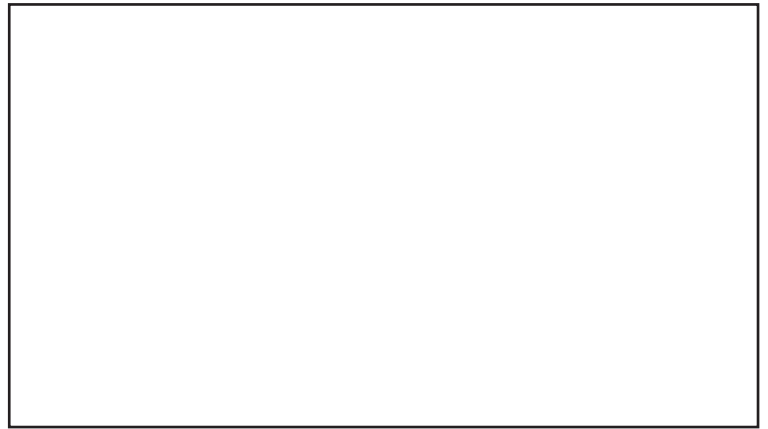
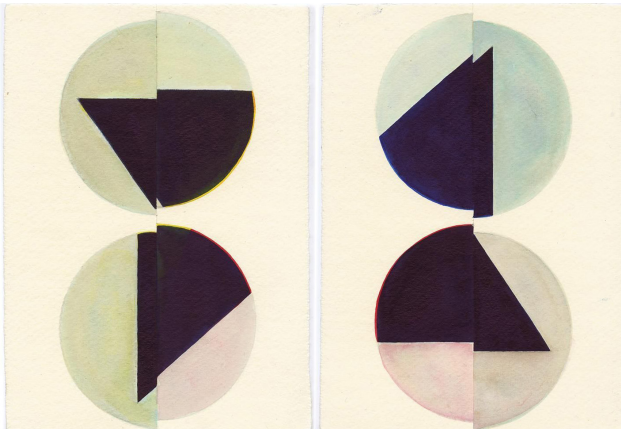


# AT HOME GALLERY GUIDE

## SHAPE WITHIN SHAPES

What shapes do you see in this work?

Look more closely at each large circle. What's different about the ones here from the one you might draw? Notice the lines don't meet, as if half the circle has slipped up or down.

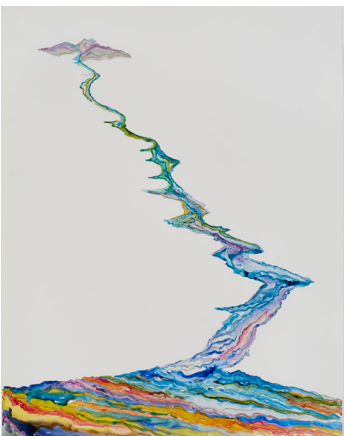
Does this remind you of anything familiar? You might have thought of a pizza because of the circle shape divided into triangles like a pie.

How has the artist made us notice those triangles? By using a heavy black she makes them stand out from the light color of the circle.

If this was a pizza, what slice would you choose? Draw your own set of circles and triangles in the box above, and add the toppings of your choice!

## COLOR STREAM

Start with the mountains and follow this imaginary river of color as it pools at the bottom. Name some colors you can see.

Find a cool color. A warm color.

How does this image make you feel? Do you think you would feel differently if it was in black and white? Why?

## OUTLINING

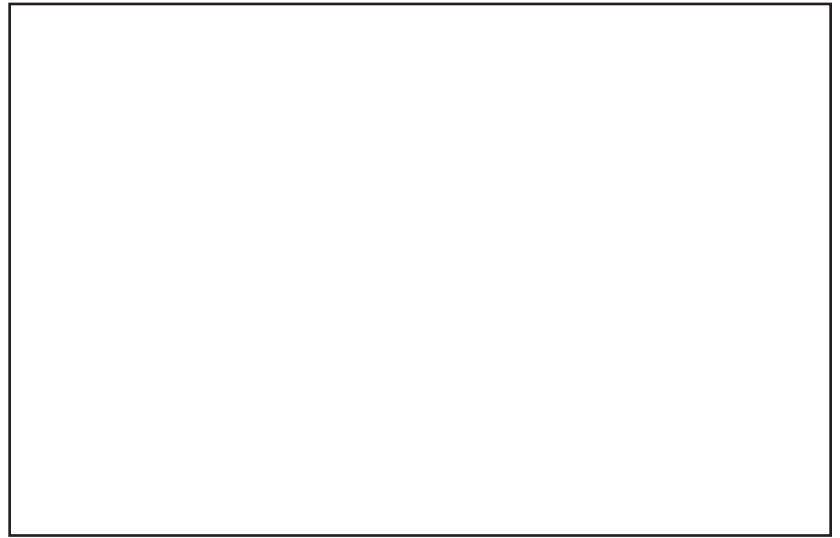


Look closely at this image and describe what's going on in this picture.

The artist has used thick black lines to indicate shapes. Can you find a face? A hand? An animal of some sort?

How does color partner with line to help us see these?

## FOLLOW THE LINE



Look for lines in this image. Try copying the thick and thin lines in the space provided above.

Do you see where lines have turned into letters. Make your own letters from lines.

Unlike the other images we have looked at, color is missing here! The artist has only used black and white. Why might that be?

Do you think the artist found this image or created it himself before photographing it? What do you see that makes you think that?
