Three-Dimensional Collages
Thursday, January 3

Create a three-dimensional version of Manuel Álvarez Bravo's *En un Pequeño Espacio* (1996) by collaging muslin, balsa wood, and string onto chipboard and finishing with a soft layer of tempera paint.



Painted Grids
Thursday Februar

Dab colored dots of brightly hued paint over a masking tape grid on watercolor paper, then remove the tape to reveal the negative space, inspired by *Grid Spit* (2009), on view in *A Brilliant Spectrum: Recent Gifts of Color Photography*.



Seated Figure Sculptures
Thursday, March 7

Sculpt a seated figure with armature wire and paper clay, inspired by Alison Saar's Inheritance (2009), on view in Out of Storage and into the Light: Sculptures That Tell Stories.



Multi-Media Landscapes Thursday, April 6

Photograph a farm animal figurine with a Polaroid camera, then create a hidden-tab landscape setting in chalk pastel, inspired by David Levinthal's process in his works on view in A Brilliant Spectrum: Recent Gifts of Color Photography.

Visitors of all ages are invited to participate in these hands-on informal workshops with SBMA Teaching Artists. Each month explore a different medium—clay, metal, ink, wood, photography, paper—inspired by works of art in the Museum's collection or special exhibitions.



Modeling Clay Sunday, January 13

Reimagine Manual Álvarez Bravo's Calabaza y Caracol (Squash and Snail) (1928) colorizing a black-and-white detail from the photograph in chalk pastel and adding a snail sculpted in primary-colored modeling clay.



Balsa Wood Sunday, February 10

Create a three-dimensional version of Tom Bianchi's minimalist beach scene, *Untitled,* 628 (1975-1983) by collaging sandpaper and balsa wood onto chipboard then finishing with tempera paint.



Air-Dry Clαy Sunday, March 10

Sculpt a kneeling figure in air-dry clay, inspired by the approximately 500-year-old, Pre-Columbian Kneeling Figure in Out of Storage and into the Light: Sculptures That Tell Stories.



Printing Ink Sunday, April 14

Play with tradition and innovation by block printing an iconic Hokusai wave in shades of blue and white over a reproduction of Asako Narahashi's land and sea photograph featuring Mount Fuji in A Brilliant Spectrum: Recent Gifts of Color Photography.

Explore the art of storytelling through activities in both the galleries and the art studio. Examining works in the exhibition *Out of Storage and into the Light: Sculptures That Tell Stories*, young artists explore the essential elements of narrative: What story does each artwork tell? How do artists create storylines? How do gestures and movement contribute to that story? Campers create visual representations of stories across a range of cultures and time periods, using a variety of media.

Deep Sky Objects Made Visible for Everyone

Through February 17, 2018 Thursdays 5 - 7 pm Saturday & Sunday 12 - 4 pm

Reimagined and designed by Los Angeles-based artist April Street, this interactive space for creative play coincides with Street's multimedia installation *The Mariners' Grand Staircase (Armoured Stars, Flying Clouds)*, on view in the Museum's Park Lobby. Both installations were inspired by the real life story of Navigator Eleanor Creesy and her husband Captain Josiah Perkins Creesy who sailed the clipper ship *Flying Cloud*, which, in 1851, set a record by sailing from New York to San Francisco in just 89 days.

A collaborative captain's log, Victorian-inspired shell paintings, nautical knot making, a shelter made of sails, sounds of the sea, and celestial star charts are all part of this fantastical voyage. Dream, read, draw, and create as you navigate your way through this artist's vision.

Teaching Assistants

During spring break, the Museum offers a weeklong SBMA Art Camp and Ceramics Camp with a variety of activities, including painting, drawing, collage, printmaking, and sculpture, structured around a specific theme. Teaching Assistant (TA) positions are for 15–18 year olds interested in art and working with children during the Museum's Art Camps at the Ridley-Tree Education Center at McCormick House (RTEC).

TAs are responsible for assisting the Teaching Artist in the classroom, preparing materials, and helping children with hands-on art making. For spring camp, TAs are needed for only one week and receive 40 hours of community service credit. Becoming a TA provides young artists with professional skills in art making and art education. TAs walk away with a solid relationship with the Museum, teaching skills, new art techniques, and more.
