

# WINTER LANDSCAPE ACTIVITY

Create a torn paper and twig winter landscape inspired by Utagawa Hiroshige's *Clear Weather After Snow, Kameyama Station 47*, from the series "53 Stations of Tōkaidō Road" (1834), a color woodblock print on paper.

## MATERIALS

- Colored paper for a background
- Wax paper
- Black paper
- Kraft paper (like a grocery bag)
- Tissue paper (or toilet paper)
- Pencil
- Glue stick
- Red crayon or red colored pencil
- Black marker
- Scissors
- Twigs

## DIRECTIONS



### STEP 1

Tear the wax paper, black paper, and tissue paper into different shapes and glue them on the colored paper to create a landscape.



### STEP 2

Place your twigs on top of your landscape.



### STEP 3

Tear the craft paper or wax paper and glue it on the top of the twigs. This layer holds the twigs in place.

### STEP 4

Trim the rough edges off your artwork. Cut out a small piece of paper to write a message or your name. Your finished artwork might look something like the piece below!
